CLIMATE CHANGE AND ENERGY: BAXTER'S POSITION

- 1. Science on climate change warrants action
- 2. Collaborative effort needed
 - Businesses: Assess opportunities, set goals, invest in new approaches
 - Countries: Financial incentives
 - Public, NGO's, Others
- 3. Kyoto represents first step, but more must be done:
 - Market-based mechanisms
 - More aggressive and creative approaches
- 4. New energy facilities should be protective of the environment
- 5. Countries should work toward energy self-sufficiency
